- Papal Encyclicals.

- *The Boys in the Boat* by Daniel James Brown: This book is about the University of Washington eight-man crew that represented the United States in the 1936 Olympics in Berlin, and narrowly beat out Italy and Germany to win the gold medal.
- *The Sisters of Sinai: How Two Lady Adventurers Discovered the Hidden Gospels* by Janice Soskice. Reads like a novel and details the experiences of two Victorian-era Scottish sisters who traverse the Middle East in search of the earliest known Syriac biblical manuscript.
- *Light of the World: The Pope, the Church and the Signs of the Times* by Peter Seewald. An interview with Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI.
- *I Will Be Called John: A Biography of Pope John XXIII* by Lawrence Elliott.
